## Whooping Cough Cases

Whooping cough (Pertussis) cases are on the rise, with babies too young to be vaccinated at greatest risk. A child's first dose would be at around 8 weeks as part of the 6 in 1 vaccine offered at their first postnatal appointment.

The NHS are recommending that all pregnant patients are vaccinated at around 20 weeks (but can be up to 32 weeks in most cases as a catch up) in order to pass on crucial antibodies to their unborn child from birth.

Pregnant patients should alert their midwife, GP or a member of reception if they have not been offered this vaccination.

#### E Coli Outbreak UK

The UKHSA has confirmed that cases of E Coli within the UK are rising, citing the likely culprit to be salad within pre prepared sandwiches and wraps. Symptoms of the infection include stomach cramps, vomiting, fever and bloody loose stools. Anyone who suspects they may have contracted E Coli should speak to a clinician in the first instance, as samples may need to be sent away for testing. Those infected should avoid preparing food for others or being in contact with immuno-compromised relatives.
